To reinforce this commitment:

1. We have a very active Anti-corruption and Transparency Unit (ACTU) that is constantly working with ICPC to conduct periodic systems checks aimed at enhancing our internal processes
2. We have established internal controls and reporting mechanisms to detect and prevent corrupt behavior.
3. We encourage whistleblowing and provide protection to those who report suspicious activities in good faith.
4. We conduct regular training and awareness programs for our staff to promote ethical conduct and compliance.

NCDMB will not hesitate to take disciplinary or legal action against any individual or organization found to be involved in corrupt practices that undermine its operations.

We encourage all stakeholders that relate with the Board to join us in building a transparent, efficient, and accountable system that promotes sustainable development and national interest.
